## 5 Module Overview

The Building elements and the historic environment module aims to give each student a practical experience of a number techniques (including site visits) which are an essential part of conservation work. This module is one of two practical modules which must be completed on the course, THE CONSERVATION OF HISTORIC MATERIALS (Practical CORE B ARC 7452) comprising a portfolio of three workshops, and BUILDING ELEMENTS AND THE HISTORIC ENVIRONMENT (Practical CORE D ARC7456) comprising a portfolio of two workshops.

To complete this practical module the student must attend two workshops and submit a portfolio of completed assignments. On completion of the two Practical modules the student will have attended at least five different workshops. The course aims to develop a holistic understanding of materials and workmanship which will go beyond the particular practical nuances of each material/situation and lead to better understanding of the historic environment as a whole.

## 6 Indicative Content

Practical CORE D Module comprises FOUR workshops from the indicative list below. The actual list of Workshops available will be published at the beginning of the academic year:

- Canals: History, heritage and practical issues
- · Recording historic buildings
- The conservation of historic interiors
- The management of traditional estates, parks and gardens
