5 Module Overview

It will provide you with a systematic understanding of approaches to researching media cultures and the opportunity to develop your insights through an area of interest, connected to your MA project.

This module is designed to engage you with current debates and theoretical development within your area of interest. It will encourage you to explore and reflect upon your own assumptions and preconceptions and to think critically and systematically about challenging topics. The module deals with the most contemporary of debates and scholarship in the field, some of which will be at the cutting edge of international research and thought.

You will be supported by a series of presentations, workshops; debates; visiting speakers; and online discussions.
