<b>5</b>	<b>Module Overview</b>
<p>The module is an opportunity to learn and critically reflect on the skills of collaboration by enabling you to create an interdisciplinary project with students from complementary disciplines, or with academic staff. Collaboration is a vital employability skill within the Creative Industries and this module allows you to develop these skills, making use of University facilities and with the support of academic staff. Within this module framework, several kinds of collaborative opportunities are available. For example, with the approval of your supervisor, you can determine a project based on your own interests; your supervisor may set you a predetermined project to enable you to work with other students in a way that is appropriate to your subject area; or there may be opportunities for you to collaborate with staff on research projects. In all cases, you must apply your subject skills to an interdisciplinary project which will be agreed in advance with your supervisor.</p>	

<b>6</b>	<b>Indicative Content</b>
<p>The module content will reflect the nature of the project. Typically, it includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Group tutorials to define the collaborative project</li> <li>• Subject specific lectures/workshops to introduce skills relevant to the project and discipline.</li> <li>• Lectures/workshops to introduce principles and techniques of collaboration and effective teamwork, including the importance of team roles and the use of online tools to enable collaboration.</li> <li>• Group working activities, including online, to enable you to experience collaborative, group projects within your own subject discipline.</li> <li>• An opportunity for each interdisciplinary group to work collaboratively to create a project in response to a set or self-determined brief, supported by tutorials.</li> <li>• An opportunity for interdisciplinary groups to present the outcomes of their project and reflect on the process of collaboration.</li> </ul>
