5	Module Overview
<p>In this practical workshop module you will be given a number of demonstrations on the use and application of Jewellery and Related Products techniques and processes.</p> <p>You will be expected to record notes that will then enable you to apply these techniques and processes independently. A range of creative project briefs will be introduced through which you will experiment and explore the design and making process from two-dimensional design through to three-dimensional realisation.</p> <p>You will generate a reflective design journal to record demonstrations, design ideas and how you have effectively applied them to your project briefs. The design journal will become a rich resource and may include, but not be limited to; images of demonstrations, notes from classes, photographs of work in progress, drawings, inspirational photographs and reflections on your development and achievement. A formative assessment will centre on your reflective journal and your three-dimensional outcomes.</p>

Learning Activities	Hours
Scheduled Learning (SL) includes lectures, practical classes and workshops, peer group learning, Graduate+, as specified in timetable	130 hours – demonstrations, group workshops and one to one tutorials 3 days a week in studio: semester one modules are front loaded in terms to scheduled teaching with reduced percentage in semester two
