5	Module Overview
<p>This module is designed to develop your ability and confidence to research material and processes and apply design development and project management to your own initiated project proposal. It is an opportunity for you to apply and consolidate the learning gained through the previous modules. This module asks you to propose, develop and realise a personal self-directed studio-based research project focused on your own specific interests. You will be expected to evaluate appropriate methods of workings for your project work that articulates your identified field of interest. With tutorial support you will be planning your own design development, recording your progress, and reflecting on your design decisions. The expectation is that you will be working with increasing independence and will be able to reason your design decision.</p> <p>This module will result in an end of year exhibition of your achievements when you will be responsible for the key decisions on how your work is presented. You will give a presentation to the group on your final project and your evaluation of the outcomes.</p>	

6	Indicative Content
<p>Group presentations 1:1 tutorials</p> <p>You will be expected to occupy a studio, workshop or base room up to three days a week. This semester there are less specific technical demonstrations from lecturers, but more studio and seminar sessions alongside one-to-one tutorials to support you in developing your own design project. A typical session may include a group discussion with lecturer at the beginning of the day followed by short personal direction or support at the bench to support you with your project work.</p>
