5 Module Overview

This module will introduce you to the workings of core institutions of public life, particularly in the fields of politics, criminal justice, education, health and social welfare and business. It will allow you to develop a deeper understanding of the importance of these areas and of important third sector organisations as sources of news.

Through lectures and your own research you will become familiar with the current debates about issues affecting all the key bodies that manage important areas of everyday life and the relationships between them.

6 Indicative Content Lead lectures will include sessions led by academic experts and senior figures from the institutions involved. You will also visit and report on local authority and other meetings.

Your learning will at all times be linked to your newsgathering and reporting and you will be given formative feedback on a range of journalistic tasks related to 'public affairs'.
