5 Module Overview

Defining and communicating effectively to an audience is key to successful illustration. This module provides an opportunity through a range of briefs to begin defining an area of practice within a professional context. Students will explore briefs within established discipline areas of illustration such as editorial, publishing, advertising and narrative/sequential, with an emphasis on producing work that can be expanded upon to reach audiences in new, innovative and exciting ways.

The structure of this module encourages the development of the multi-faceted skills that are required within the creative industry today. Students will engage with a mixture of theoretical lectures, visiting lectures/workshops, one-day projects, group and individual tutorials, group critiques and integrated analogue and digital skills workshops. Students will learn how to use and develop analytical and creative thinking skills as a starting point in order to produce and create a series of successful illustrative outcomes.

6 Indicative Content

The module will consist of a combination of lectures, workshops, presentations and tutorials; developing further your understanding of the contextual themes that underpin your discipline whilst focusing on the application of knowledge and appropriate skills to support your practice.

The focus of the level will be to transform you from an active learner to an autonomous learner.
