## 5 Module Overview

What do managers do? The traditional picture of the manager is one of a bureaucrat with rigid ways of thinking and checklists to ensure compliance with processes and rules. Is this relevant to today's organisation? Contemporary thinking suggests not. Today's successful organisations are those where management is less about task and control and more about enabling people to contribute. The best managers guide, coach and empower colleagues, and constructively challenge ideas to encourage and secure high performance.

This module introduces you to the role of the manager starting from its history and characteristics. You will critically analyse the latest thinking from leading researchers about the cost to organisations of managers who stifle creativity and kill new ideas, and the problems created by outdated approaches to management. Today's professional managers need to be able to research, analyse, think critically, reflect on learning, build networks, and present information. They are independent learners, exercise personal responsibility but also work well with others. They negotiate and collaborate and build teams around them, inspiring others by being effective role models. You'll explore and practise the skills, attributes and attitude the effective professional manager needs.
