## 5 Module Overview

Black Political Activism introduces students to the different approaches that have been used to resist racism across the African Diaspora. We will explore a range of liberal, radical and contemporary forms of activism and root this in a discussion of how society is understood. The module engages with a range of case of studies of organisations and politics, and will also consider intersectionality in the context of Black political activism.

The module connects into the degree's aim to be academically excellent, rooted as it in the expertise of the staff within the department and teaching fundamental knowledge for a students to engage with an understand society. The module is also rooted in the idea of applied knowledge, using theory to understand activist movements and considering how to engage in the present day context. The module is also interdisciplinary, drawing on a range of perspectives. Black Political Activism has an international dimension drawing on case studies from the US, Caribbean, Latin American and the African continent, as well as those in the UK.
