5 Module Overview

You will develop expertise in the capture and manipulation of audio/video data through practical experimentation. A sound understanding of technical concepts will be required in order to deliver realistic solutions to a broad range of real-world problems that you will encounter.

This module forms a core part of the production element of the course, providing the knowledge related to the production of video artefacts, focusing on planning, video production, post production, and video compression.

The skills developed here will allow you to work with audio and video content throughout the course.

6 Indicative Content

Video pre-production

Conveying ideas through writing. Presenting formal pre-production documentation. Demonstrating technical knowledge through planning.

Video conventions

Framing conventions and creative techniques.

Camera operation

Operating cameras in manual operation. White balancing, manual focusing, depth of field and aperture/iris settings.

Sound recording

Use, application and placement of microphones, managing audio levels, syncing and dubbing.

Lighting techniques

Three point lighting, colour temperature, gels and filters, creative use of lighting. Safe setup and operation of lighting.
