## 5 Module Overview

This is one of the two inter-professional modules in the programme, delivered by HCPC registered healthcare professional tutors and other specialists from Birmingham City University. This module will emphasise the underpinning philosophies of inter professional collaboration and communication within health and social care, enabling shared learning across professional boundaries and facilitating the contextualisation of the knowledge, skills and behaviours needed to deliver optimal care within a dynamic healthcare environment.

To align with the highly practice-led, knowledge-applied nature of the programme, this module will make relevant the links between personal and professional development, with an emphasis on keeping the service user at the centre of the learning experience. The programme philosophy places a high value on student responsibility and transformational learning (Mezirow, 1997) and as such, this module will encourage engagement in life-long learning by drawing on previous life experience, appraising the literature and reflecting on practice based opportunities. This will be applied to analysing the psychological background to health and illness behaviour and when considering the models for health promotion.

In this module you can expect to engage with a variety of blended learning opportunities. The module content includes pre- and post- session activities to expand your knowledge-base and prepare you for discussion of the topics covered in class. These activities might include reading academic resources on the topics, reviewing video or audio presentations, engaging in discussion on the module forums, or searching for information on the internet. These sources of information have been selected to help you develop in this module, becoming more familiar with the practical and theoretical elements of evidence based professional practice.
