<p><b>Rationale</b>          This module aims to provide you with the opportunity to develop the core knowledge and skills necessary to work in the area of wound management. You will be introduced to the concepts of wound management and how they relate to your role as a trainee assistant practitioner.</p> <p>When you have successfully completed this module you will have a more in-depth understanding of the anatomy and physiology of wound healing as well as developed your knowledge and skills in relation to wound assessment and treatment.</p> <p>As work-based learning remains the very essence of the programme, you will have the opportunity to combine your previous experience with your newly acquired knowledge and apply this immediately into your practice.
