#### 5 Module Overview

## Relationship with Programme Philosophy and Aims

The philosophy of the midwifery programme is to develop students with the ability to practice safely, effectively and proficiently resulting in them being fit to practice at the point of registration. This module equips students with knowledge of anatomy, physiology and pharmacology relevant to postnatal care of the mother, linking key clinical skills required for the safe midwifery practice.

This links to the Aim of the programme by facilitating theory and clinical skills relevant to postnatal care of the mother for the first year of the programme.
