5	Module Overview
<p>The content of the module will introduce a range of common assessment tools and will provide you with the knowledge and skills to enable you to assess and plan care for an acutely ill adult in a range of settings.</p> <p>To help contextualise the theories you will meet three case studies who are used as exemplars to whom you will apply the assessment process and attendant tools. The relevant principles of anatomy and physiology will be introduced and will be applied to the module case studies to help you understand what is happening to these patients and why.</p> <p>You will be encouraged to assess and observe your patient case studies and to explore and explain why they might be displaying abnormal vital signs / observations / behaviors and to propose appropriate nursing interventions to manage their care in a safe and timely manner.</p> <p>The Module aims to further develop your nursing skills, knowledge and attributes so that you are able to contribute safely and effectively in clinical placements commensurate with your level of training as a second year student nurse.</p> <p>Successful completion of this module should facilitate students to understand the underlying physiological responses to acute illness and to practice clinical decision making using a range of clinical skills and appropriate assessment tools to ensure safe, timely and appropriate person-centred care. This will contribute to your development as an Adult Nurse.</p>
