5 Module Overview

Relationship with Programme Philosophy and Aims

This module will build upon the second year module "professional values and evidence based practice" and furthers students understanding of research-based evidence. In this module students continue to assess the relevance, quality and application of research-based evidence. Students are required to write a literature review, consider the research findings arising from the literature review, propose a nursing practice change based on this literature review findings and then consider issues relevant for changing nursing practice.

A specific feature of integrative review methodology is the critical appraisal chosen literature. This involves critically evaluating different sources of research-based information including primary and secondary sources of evidence. Interpretation of qualitative and quantitative research findings is required.

A flexible learning approach is taken in concordance with the university's learning and teaching strategy. Key lectures on literature review design and implementing change in practice will be supplemented by supervisory support, individual learning activities, assignment support sessions and media-based independent study.
