5 Module Overview

Rationale

The BSc (Hons) Diagnostic Radiography programme aims to prepare you for a career in diagnostic radiography, where you should be continually seeking to improve the patient experience and your own expertise. To enable this development therefore, you will be supported in developing the skills required in a reflective practitioner and documenting these within an e-portfolio. (This is your Professional Development Portfolio)

Alignment with Programme Philosophy and Aims

This module addresses that aim by introducing you to the professional world you have elected to enter and explores your new clinical role in this context. Teaching sessions will emphasise the importance of good communication and an appreciation of the patient perspective to improve patient care, taking into account the wide cultural, religious and ethnic population you will be caring for in clinical practice. All professionals should be in a position to reflect on their development, and within this module you will be encouraged and supported in this, through development of an e-Portfolio.

Learning and Teaching Strategy

In this module you will be attending lectures, participating in classroom discussions and workshops, with supporting e-portfolio (Mahara) workshops. Moodle will be used to support the module. Many teaching sessions will be conducted alongside BSc (Hons) Radiotherapy students and BSc (Hons) Medical Ultrasound which provide an opportunity for interdisciplinary working. This module prepares you for safe clinical practice by allowing you to apply the material learnt to the placement setting.
