5	Module Overview
<p>This problem-based module enables students to develop, utilise and further apply pedagogical skills in a real world setting. The module will provide an opportunity for students to critically develop their learning and experience, as well as work on a live piece of investigation by agreement with the placement provider. Application of subject knowledge and the national curriculum for PE will be key to the successful completion of this work. This module will also provide an opportunity to develop essential employability attributes (e.g. interpersonal skills) which students will further develop from the Level 5 PE and School Sport Work Placement module.</p> <p>This module is underpinned by the need, as a developing PE and school sport practitioner, to be exposed to real workplace settings. The range of experiences that students will gain from working within the busy school and work place environment will enable reflection and the adaptation of professional practice, as well as the application of elements covered at both Level 5 and Level 6.</p> <p>The evidence base for this module draws upon contemporary literature within both reflective and professional practice to ensure that students develop skills for life-long learning.</p> <p>The programme aims to develop your collaborative skills. Therefore, whilst studying this module, students can expect to work with, and learn from, external partners from a primary, secondary or coaching background, in relation to PE and school sport. The module will enable students to become a more independent, self-directed learners, who take ownership of their personal and professional development, which is a key part of the programme philosophy. The placement module will provide some of the skills necessary to achieve this as students will be required to manage their own online reflective learning tasks and apply this to their own professional development. The Level 5 Certificate in Primary School Physical Education Specialism award is expected to form the foundation for applying enhanced subject knowledge of PE and how the curriculum might be taught, alongside further enhancing and supporting a school sport programme to facilitate healthy and active lifestyles amongst students.</p> <p>This module will primarily involve “distance learning” whereby students undertake a double semester placement within a PE and school sport setting. Online resources will be provided via Moodle and students will be required to undertake tasks to complement the assessment process.</p>
